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### **Air Conditioning Memo**

#### **Happy Spring!**

As the weather begins to heat up, we'd like to offer the following A/C information.

#### Window AC Weight Restriction

The Board voted to ban all window air conditioners that exceed a weight of 50 lbs. The reason for the rule is because heavy air conditioners create stress on the windowframes and could result in the A/C unit becoming a safety hazard (see below). The lighter units cause less stress on the windows/window frames and the reduced condensation lessens damage to the masonry façade. The Board also voted to impose a \$25.00 per day fine against units that do not comply with this rule.

#### Safety

Window air conditioners can pose a serious safety issue. Residents are responsible for the proper installation of their air conditioners. An improperly installed A/C unit could create a serious safety hazard. We strongly recommend that you install a standalone/floor model (see below). All window Air Conditioners cannot exceed 40 lbs. and must be installed in accordance with the manufactures instructions.

## Portable Floor Model ACs

Floor model or "portable" A/C units are self contained systems that do not require any permanent installation. They come with an exhaust venting tube and a window vent adapter kit. To use these units you must vent the hot air exhaust out of a nearby window.

These units are comparable in cost to window A/Cs and are energy efficient. Home Depot, for example, is currently selling a 8,000 BTU unit for \$395. LG Model# LP0821GSSM

#### **Efficiency**

Energy efficient A/C units that are properly rated for the size of your unit provide the most comfort. A unit that is too small will run continually without cooling the room effectively. On the other hand, if you buy a unit that's too large for the space you're cooling, it actually will be less effective than one that's the correct size. Bigger isn't necessarily better.
